**Center for Afterschool Education at Foundations, Inc. Partners with
Arcadia University for Institute in Out-of-School Time Education**

**Institute provides graduate and undergraduate credit-bearing course in
out-of-school settings.**

Moorestown, New Jersey, March 26, 2009 — The Center for Afterschool Education at Foundations, Inc. and Arcadia University are partnering to offer a three-credit Institute, *Teaching and Learning in Out-of-School Time*. The Institute will be held July 24-26, 2009, at Arcadia University in Glenside, PA.

The Institute responds to the growing demand to maximize educational opportunities outside of the school day by preparing students and in-service professionals to teach and lead in afterschool and summer settings. Bringing together afterschool, summer, and experiential educators from around the country, the Institute teaches research-based methods and practical strategies to leverage out-of-school time for children’s academic, social, and emotional development. For graduate students, the Institute is the first course toward earning a 15-credit online Graduate Certificate in Out-of-School Time Education.

“Out-of-school time is too valuable a resource for children to waste,” says Rhonda H. Lauer, CEO of Foundations, Inc. “We need educators who truly understand the potential of afterschool to help children succeed in school and beyond, and who know how to make afterschool hours dynamic, engaging, fun – and educational.”

The Institute and the Graduate Certificate in Out-of-School Time Education are part of a nationwide effort to help close the achievement gap by improving the quality of teaching and learning opportunities across the school day, after school, during the summer, in communities, and at home.

“Schools are not the only place children learn, and teachers are not the only ones responsible for children’s learning and healthy development,” Lauer states. “We are delighted to partner with Arcadia University in developing a skilled workforce of educators who round out classroom learning with robust programs of projects and activities across the day.”

The Graduate Certificate in Out-of-School Time Education program begins with the three-day Institute, followed by three online courses and an applied learning project. Credits earned may be applied toward a master's degree in Education.
